- Academic

Report for Parish Council Meeting, May 7, 2018

St. Leo The Great School Board
April 17, 2018 Meeting

I. Standing Committee Reports:

- Public Relations: The Parrish Newsletter was sent out. Progress on the new website continues - the target date for website completion is August 20th. "A Day in the Life" video be a part of the website and will include students from the second, fifth and seventh grades. These students will highlight what goes on in different stages of being at school at St. Leo's.
- Policy: Several healthcare professionals attended the meeting to talk about the large number of illnesses this year and how to prevent the spread of infection. The best method to prevent the spread of germs is to simply wash hands for at least 20 seconds. The Student Council will be asked to make posters for next year that encourage students to get the flu vaccine, practice good hand washing, stay at home when you're sick, and to cover their mouth when coughing and sneezing.
- Planning: The planning committee met in March and is working on finalizing the plans for the outdoor area. The plan will then be presented to the building and grounds committee for approval. The playground will be moved this summer – exact placement is still to be determined. Eagle Scout, Logan Paulukow, may work on one an element of this project.
- Nominations: The committee received 12 applications for new school board members. The four members who are moving off (Ed Snider, Julie Richards, Tracy Carroll and Ron Fink) will be replaced by Mark Magyar, Gretchen Reasner, Sean Francey and Ellen Eschenwald. New members will be invited to attend the June School Board meeting.
- Spiritual Life: Committee members read various books on poverty, the Saints, and how to help others, and discussed how they can be 'the hands and feet of Jesus' throughout the Lenten season. Poster winners were announced at a morning assembly and ribbons were given out. Students wrote down their corporal works of mercy on pictures of feet and these feet were placed on large stretches of paper in the hallways and gym. Father Hahn heard confessions from all grades during Lent.
- Security and Safety: A presentation on cyber security will be given to both parents and middle school students later this month. Parents will receive an email with details and parishioners will also be informed. The committee is still looking into a sign-in system for any visitors to the school.

II. Ad Hoc Committee Reports

- a. PTO: The committee will meet this week and discuss the outcome, tally the final numbers, etc. for Let's Dance. This year was highly attended and was a great success. Many of the decorations were sold to help recoup costs. A survey will be given out in the near future to gather feedback about the event.
- b. Development: No report.
- c. Finance: Frank Kuchinski reported that finances are on track for this year, and the budget for next year is still being finalized, pending enrollment numbers. The school is looking to hire a full-time ILA teacher and a half-time religion teacher for next year.

St Leo's Hempfield Food Pantry team will work this month on Wednesday May 31st 8:30am to 1:00pm at the Zion Evangelical Lutheran Church 85 Brandt Blvd Landisville, Pa. (physical location of the food pantry).

The Food Pantry collects donations and distributes food to needy families in East and West Hempfield every Monday and Wednesday from 9:00am to 1:00pm.

Normally, 500 to 800 families are assisted monthly.

The Hempfield Food Pantry secures food donations through local, state and federal food distribution.

Each family receiving assistance must be screened and qualify as to their need for food assistance.
